Foreword

When Wen-Pin Leow told me, in the autumn of 2017, that he intended to write his Master's by Research thesis at the University of Aberdeen on the Psalms of Ascent, I immediately agreed. Ever since my student days, Psalms 120–134 have been greatly important to me—because of the poetic beauty of the individual psalms, the way in which they hang together, their theological message and their historical background. I vividly remember the lectures Andrew Macintosh gave to us, a small group of advanced undergraduates and Diploma students in 1988–9 at the Faculty of Oriental Studies (now famously renamed as 'Faculty of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies!') of Cambridge University. They introduced us to philological subtleties and historical dimensions we had hitherto been unfamiliar with, and they kindled our interest in Hebrew poetry.

So I am very glad today to write this foreword. Wen-Pin Leow has turned an excellent piece of research of the typical size of a Master's thesis into an even better, massive study of the 'Pilgrim Songs'. It provides a fresh perspective on them, approaching them from the angle of Cognitive Linguistics and Critical Spatiality, with a particularly interesting 'take' on Henri Lefebvre and Michel Foucault.

I hope that Wen-Pin's study will enable scholars and the educated public more deeply to understand the Psalms of Ascent and to savour their more hidden features. I commend it to the reader with enthusiasm.
